

Below is a synopsis from Core of what has transpired with this applicant and Core's attempt to rectify the situation. This has certainly gone above the ability of Core to resolve this as it appears to be a matter for law enforcement due to the theft claims and unreasonable expectations, claims, and demands by the applicant. As you are aware, I met with homeowners, Mr. and Mrs. of Community, today, September 21, 2016 at 8:30am. Today's meeting represents the third meeting with the Homeowners since

Thursday, September 15th, 2016, it was communicated to us via the Shelter At Home call center that personal effects of the Homeowner's were put at the street for trash pickup. On Friday, September 16, 2016, met with the homeowners to ascertain what was improperly removed from the house.

On Monday, September 19th, 2016, yourself met with the homeowners to ascertain the extent of their loss and what CORE could do to relieve their distress. At that time, the Homeowners stated their discarded belongings were worth approximately \$5,000.00. On Wednesday, September 21, 2016, I met with them to see if CORE could relieve their distress and resolve all remaining issues. In good faith, I attempted to resolve the matter by offering to sheetrock, tape, float and paint the entire home and to provide floors throughout. Such was rejected. The Homeowners then demanded \$1.2 million dollars to resolve any claim, and then, after thinking about it, they reduced their demand to \$500,000.00.

Numerous conversations with the Homeowners have been conducted, to no avail.

The Homeowners admitted to me that their personal effects and collectibles were covered by insurance. However, when asked for any sort of appraisal information, they demurred stating that it was thrown away and that the appraiser was now dead. As such, I am unable to obtain a list of the items or values to confirm any alleged loss.



Below is a synopsis from Core of what has transpired with this applicant and Core's attempt to rectify the situation. This has certainly gone above the ability of Core to resolve this as it appears to be a matter for law enforcement due to the theft claims and unreasonable expectations, claims, and demands by the applicant. Thursday, September 15th, 2016, it was communicated to us via the Shelter At Home call center that personal effects of the Homeowner's were put at the street for trash pickup.

On Friday, September 16, 2016, met with the homeowners to ascertain what was improperly removed from the house.

On Monday, September 19th, 2016, yourself met with the homeowners to ascertain the extent of their loss and what CORE could do to relieve their distress. At that time, the Homeowners stated their discarded belongings were worth approximately \$5,000.00.

On Wednesday, September 21, 2016, I met with them to see if CORE could relieve their distress and resolve all remaining issues. In good faith, I attempted to resolve the matter by offering to sheetrock, tape, float and paint the entire home and to provide floors throughout. Such was rejected. The Homeowners then demanded \$1.2 million dollars to resolve any claim, and then, after thinking about it, they reduced their demand to \$500,000.00.

Numerous conversations with the Homeowners have been conducted, to no avail.

The Homeowners admitted to me that their personal effects and collectibles were covered by insurance. However, when asked for any sort of appraisal information, they demurred stating that it was thrown away and that the appraiser was now dead. As such, I am unable to obtain a list of the items or values to confirm any alleged loss.

I wasn't sure if they would ask him so I provided some background information.) He says this program isn't going to give him money that's not what it is about. We weren't trying to get money, we were trying to just provide information to them. The rep then says, well we didn't know the home owner was deaf we can't do the inspection. Ms. I and puts me on speaker phone. I asked him why he couldn't continue with the interpreter? He stated he didn't know what she was relaying so he couldn't do it. He said if a family member was there he would do it. I said, how would you know what the family member was relaying? It's the same situation. You have the homeowner there with a certified interpreter and we have to be pushed back! Makes no sense. We have been dealing with so many issues like this since they are deaf and this is the last straw! Clearly the deaf community is not being treated fairly!!!! One Month Mark for the Louisiana Shelter at Home Program

Baton Rouge, LA (September 28) – The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) continues helping people return home with temporary repairs through the Louisiana Shelter at Home Program. An estimated 150 thousand homes in Louisiana received damage during the massive August 2016 flood event. The Shelter at Home Program enables eligible individuals or families whose homes were damaged to take shelter in their own homes while they rebuild.

"Governor John Bel Edwards listened to the public's call for this type of help following the flood," said GOHSEP Director Jim Waskom. "Shelter at Home is not meant to be the final step for a homeowner. It will provide you with a chance to stay in your home while you decide on long range plans and make final repairs. Registration for this historic program started one month ago. Shelter at Home is only one of the emergency housing solutions available to the public, but this unique approach will likely benefit thousands focused on staying home."

"The goal is to keep our communities whole while we all work on this tremendous recovery process," said Governor John Bel Edwards. We are working daily to continue to make the program even more responsive to homeowners' needs and provide the maximum amount of recovery help available under FEMA funding guidelines."

The program evaluates each applicant's home. If \$15,000 of work in that home can create a safe, secure, habitable place for the family to live while they continue their permanent home rebuilding, then that applicant may be eligible for this program. Contractors and subcontractors involved in the program will perform initial work such as mucking out the house, basic electrical restoration, installing a basic water heater, removing wet wall insulation, and providing up to \$500 in basic cooking or refrigerating appliances. This work will be provided at no out-of-pocket cost to the eligible homeowner. This assistance is independent of and will not affect determination of any Individual Assistance grant from FEMA. These essential emergency cleanup and minor repairs will help families get a jumpstart on their full recovery and live in at least a portion of their home, while they continue to finish the big task of making permanent repairs to their home.

One Month Mark for the Louisiana Shelter at Home Program

Baton Rouge, LA (September 28) – The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) continues helping people return home with temporary repairs through the Louisiana Shelter at Home Program. An estimated 150 thousand homes in Louisiana received damage during the massive August 2016 flood event. The Shelter at Home Program enables eligible individuals or families whose homes were damaged to take shelter in their own homes while they rebuild.

"Governor John Bel Edwards listened to the public's call for this type of help following the flood," said GOHSEP Director Jim Waskom. "Shelter at Home is not meant to be the final step for a homeowner. It will provide you with a chance to stay in your home while you decide on long range plans and make final repairs. Registration for this historic program started one month ago. Shelter at Home is only one of the emergency housing solutions available to the public, but this unique approach will likely benefit thousands focused on staying home."

"The goal is to keep our communities whole while we all work on this tremendous recovery process," said Governor John Bel Edwards. We are working daily to continue to make the program even more responsive to homeowners' needs and provide the maximum amount of recovery help available under FEMA funding guidelines."

The program evaluates each applicant's home. If \$15,000 of work in that home can create a safe, secure, habitable place for the family to live while they continue their permanent home rebuilding, then that applicant may be eligible for this program. Contractors and subcontractors involved in the program will perform initial work such as mucking out the house, basic electrical restoration, installing a basic water heater, removing wet wall insulation, and providing up to \$500 in basic cooking or refrigerating

appliances. This work will be provided at no out-of-pocket cost to the eligible homeowner. This assistance is independent of and will not affect determination of any Individual Assistance grant from FEMA. These essential emergency cleanup and minor repairs will help families get a jumpstart on their full recovery and live in at least a portion of their home, while they continue to finish the big task of making permanent repairs to their home.



I would like share some positive feed to go to the group at shelter at home. I do not know the actual subcontractors but the overseer was SLS contractors. Our experience was great! there were three to four guys that came to our home to perform the "shelter at home" work. They brought in a machine, mops, cleaning supplies, new doors, new toilets, refrigerator, hot plate, sheetrock, they were prepared to come and help us get back to our home. The guys sanitized our

floors, replaced our door for the master bathroom, put in a new toilet, clean and sanitized the tub and shower in the master bedroom, cleaned our AC unit and went into the attic and clean, changed and replaced ducts and coils, reinstated our kitchen cabinet and sink they sheetrock master bathroom, cleaned our shower, went behind our Jacuzzi tub to make sure there were not mold or mildew and sprayed, did a fogger for pest control, checked our washer and dryer for corrosion (we were able to save it), checked my range, sweep off our front entrance, installed the carbon monoxide device and gave us the 4.6 cubic refrigerator and hot plate. We didn't received a microwave ours still work and signed a waiver for the 220 plug since our stove/range is hardwired. Our experience with shelter at home was truly a great experience. We were told that our home was the first home for these subcontractors. Well thank God! Praise the name of Jesus! they did a good job. Hopefully, I did not miss anything

Your Comment We applied with FEMA for a Mobile Home Unit and were interviewed by phone on 8/27/16 and again on 9/5/16. We were told we were eligible because we have been living in a camper in our driveway on our 5.2 acre property. Our double wide mobile home was destroyed by the flood. Knocked from its foundation with separation of the marriage wall. I am disabled and my husband works, but is a cardiac patient with 2 bypass surgeries in the last 7 yrs. We have tried to salvage some of our belongings, but cannot find storage anywhere. We've been told since 9/5/16 that there will be an inspector who will come to our property to do an inspection for the MHU. We have the perfect location for one. We had a single wide on the property until early March of this year. The Entergy pole, septic system, well water pipes and all are right there ready for connections. We just don't understand what is taking so long. Yesterday, we saw the first MHU in our area. Placed in front of a home that was just built weeks before the flood. The family had not even moved into the home at the time of the flood and they have a trailer while we are still in this camper. I call FEMA weekly and am told the same thing. We have applied with the CRA hut they want up to nut up all the money to rebuild first and

then they will reimburse us. We don't have the money to do that! We've applied for the shelter at home program, but we know we have over \$15,000 in damages to be able to get the home livable. It would require a new foundation just for starters. I apologize for the length of this message, but we just don't know where to turn at this point. We are getting up in age and were less than 2 years from paying off our mortgage, all of our vehicles were paid for, and now we are looking at having to start over with a 30 year mortgage, we have 2 vehicle notes, and a camper note to pay. It's crazy how this has just destroyed our life! I know there are many others suffering just as we are and we pray for all daily. We just want a safe place to live. We are scared to death that a storm is going to come our way and we don't even have a way to move this camper. We had to have the camper company deliver it here to us. The bottom line is this: If there is anything you can do to get FEMA to get out here and inspect this property so we can get a mobile home, please, please do it. We are desperate to get settled in a home. We are in this camper for 7 weeks now with 3 adults and 2 dogs. We have a water hose connected for water and can only urinate in the bathroom here. We have to put on respirators to go over to our moldinfested house to use the one working bathroom, which doesn't work properly either because all of the septic piping was washed around under the house due to the high current of the flood waters. I know this is probably too much information, but I need you to understand how desperate for help we are. We have no money to go anywhere else, paying the mortgage on our home, this camper, and vehicle notes along with all of our other pre-flood bills. Please help us. Thank you so much for taking the time to read this and I sincerely pray that you can intervene on our behalf with FEMA. Thank you and may God bless you as you lead us through this catastrophe.

Here are the latest Shelter At Home numbers you requested (as reported out by AECOM yesterday afternoon).

We have 20,502 applicants, with more than 17,169 of those applicants so far determined eligible for an initial inspection of their home.

- 9,162 people have had their initial inspection and are now in the construction phase of the process, and another 13,251 people have an initial inspection scheduled.
- 8,803 work orders have been issued, and of those 6,545 homes are in construction progress (meaning that the work order has been issued to the contractor but no final inspection has been passed yet).
- 1,968 homes have passed their final site visit inspection, which means they are complete.
- 2,829 homes have a final site visit scheduled.
- 338 failed their final site visit inspection, so they have more work to be completed before final passing.
- 6,421 people have withdrawn from the program after applying.
- 667 applicants were found to be ineligible for various reasons such as the home not being their primary residence, not owing the home, needing more work than \$15,000 to make a safe habitable space, and other reasons.

FEMA Offers Eligibility Clarification for Shelter at Home Program Applicants

BATON ROUGE — Today, the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) received a letter from Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Federal Coordinating Officer, Gerard Stolar, clarifying the qualifications of particular residences in FEMA's Shelter and Temporary Power program as it is being implemented in Louisiana's Shelter at Home (SAH) program.

GOHSEP requested the clarification by letter on September 16, 2016 in order to determine the eligibility of Manufactured Housing Units, Manufactured Modular Homes, travel trailers, campers, RVs or similar vehicles for participation in the SAH program.

"I appreciate FEMA offering additional clarification on this matter," said Gov. Edwards. "Many Louisianans affected by the flood waters have been working hard every single day to recover their homes and bring a sense of normalcy to their lives. I know this process can be lengthy and taxing and I hope that this clarification will bring aid to more people who are in serious need."

In his letter, Mr. Stolar has offered the following clarification:

- Manufactured Housing Units (whether or not attached to the ground, with or without wheels) and Manufactured Modular Homes could potentially qualify for assistance under the SAH program.
- Whether these types of manufactured homes would be technically feasible or cost prohibitive for such assistance is a case-by-case determination under the auspices of the SAH program guidance, and is still limited to the established cap of \$15,000 per unit.
- Travel trailers, campers, RVs or other similar vehicles are recreational in nature and are not eligible for the SAH program.

Louisiana Shelter at Home Program (SAH)

FACT SHEET

WHAT IS THIS?

The Shelter at Home Program enables eligible individuals or families whose homes were damaged in the August flooding to take shelter in their own homes while they rebuild, instead of having to stay in a hotel, rental or mass shelter.

Legal Right of Entry and Indemnification

You will need to sign a Legal Right of Entry and Indemnification Form. See end of this document for what this means or call 1-800-927-0216.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Single-family owner-occupied properties are eligible for damage remediation designed to make the home safe and habitable for a cost not to exceed \$15,000. Remediation work will be performed by contractors hired by the State. The Shelter at Home program allows residents to quickly and safely shelter in their own home. Only properties that are determined to be able to be brought up to the "safe and habitable" standard will be eligible to participate in the program. An Inspector will determine if a home can be made safe and habitable within the funding limitations, for example: if flood waters have not exceeded 24 inches in a home, it is likely the property will be eligible. The program does specify that floodwater amounts higher than that may be inspected and approved on a case-by-case basis.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The program evaluates each applicant's home and, if up to \$15,000 of work in that home can create a safe, secure, habitable place for the family to live while they continue their permanent home rebuilding, then that applicant may be eligible for this program. Very basic initial work will include items such as mucking out the house, basic electrical restoration, installing a basic water heater, removing wet wall insulation, and providing up to \$500 in basic cooking or refrigerating appliances. This work will be provided at no out-of-pocket cost to the eligible homeowner. This assistance is independent of and will not affect determination of any Individual Assistance grant from FEMA. These essential emergency cleanup and minor repairs will help families get a jumpstart on their full recovery and live in at least a portion of their home, while they continue to finish the big task of making permanent repairs to their home.

WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR THIS PROGRAM?

Many residents are desperately ready to go home, but their homes are not safe and sanitary yet. If you are ready to leave the shelter, rental apartment or hotel room; if you are ready to go home, this is the program for you.

Keep in mind that this program provides the **bare minimum necessary** to get you back in your home so that you can begin the tasks of rebuilding.

NOTE: You do not have to be registered with FEMA in order to take advantage of this program. All people interested in this program must apply individually (separately from registering with FEMA or SBA or filing a flood insurance claim with NFIP)

Hi Claire,

Thanks for your inquiry into the Shelter at Home program. It has been in place since August 29 and the statistics for the areas that you requested are below. To better help you understand the numbers it is important to note that the contractors were selected and started September 12, one week after the program was established. That means the actual work has only been going on for about two weeks. Once a homeowner is determined to be eligible for the program, the inspector and contractor set up a time to meet with the homeowner to go over what work needs to be done. Everyone, the homeowner, contractor and inspector, must approve the work at the beginning and at the end before a work order is considered complete. Scheduling a time for everyone to meet can sometimes cause a delay at any point in the process. We now have nine main contractors and they have hired sub-contractors so the work will begin ramping up next week. Consequently, we anticipate that while the number of work orders will rise so will the number of completed homes.

There is no deadline to apply for Shelter at Home.

Thanks for your inquiry into the Shelter at Home program. This program to help bring people back home has been in place since August 29 and the statistics for the areas that you requested are below.

To better help set the context for these numbers, it is important to note that the state selected the first round of contractors for this program and then by Sept 12th had begun construction on the first group of pilot homes. So construction in homes has been in progress for about two weeks now.

The progression is: a homeowner is determined to be eligible for the program; the inspector and contractor then set up a time to meet with the homeowner to go over what work needs to be done; then three parties -- the homeowner, the contractor designated to work on that home and a program inspector -- must do a walk-through inspection approve the eligibility and the scope of work at the beginning of the project, and then another walk-through final inspection accepting the work at the end of construction, before a work order is considered complete. Scheduling a time for everyone to meet can sometimes cause a delay at those inspection points in the process.

Of the 19,333 applicants to the program so far, more than 9,832 homes have been determined eligible; 3,124 homes statewide are already inspected and in the construction phase; another 5,641 homes are scheduled for inspections now; 140 homes have a final site visit scheduled; and 77 homes are completed, meaning they have passed their final site visit.

The state now has nine (9) prime contractors working, and each of those has multiple subcontractors. So the pace of this work began ramping up over the past week and will continue to do so from here on out at an even greater pace. Consequently, we anticipate that you will see the number of completed homes rise next week. Also, for the homes in the parishes for which you requested statistics, Lemoine is the prime contractor.

October 15th is the deadline to apply for Shelter At Home.

Julie – can you clarify the request for AmeriCorps members assisting non-applicants? My understanding was that the first goal was to get those 2200 people to apply to SAH, and that Brod was going to initiate a robocall for that purpose. AECOM was then going to provide a list of SAH applicants who were a) inspected, but b) "on hold" because their initial estimates were above the \$15K threshold, and c) had not yet been mucked out. We were then going to direct AmeriCorps resources to those homes to get them mucked out and then hopefully SAH eligible. That was my takeaway from the meeting – let me know if I missed something and we can try to assist. Either way, we have not yet received a list of "on hold" SAH households.

2 related notes regarding non-profit rebuilding groups.

- There is confusion among rebuilding agencies statewide about the best way to interface with SAH and how best to have a unified rebuilding strategy. I think it would be very helpful if the Governor's office could convene these organizations, along with AECOM and Volunteer Louisiana, to answer questions and hammer out some strategy.
- A related issue is using nonprofits as subcontractors to bring down costs for those above the \$15k mark and get them eligible. I have reached out to Heather at AECOM multiple times for guidance but have yet to get a response. This could also be addressed in a meeting.

Manufactured Housing Unit Process FEMA Direct Housing Assistance/DR-4277-LA



Start

Step 1:

The units arrive at local staging areas in Louisiana as FEMA identifies disaster survivors who have no other housing options.

Step 2:

FEMA notifies applicant of eligibility for manufactured housing unit.

Step 3:

Eligible applicant proposes a location for placement.

Step 4:

The parish approves the private, commercial, or group site.

Step 5:

Floodplain designation is determined. If private site is in a floodplain, FEMA can install MHU only if there is no other available option within a reasonable distance (rental unit, commercial site MHU).



Finish

Step 6:

FEMA inspects proposed site for suitability (ingress, egress, power, water, sewer, environmental, soil).

Step 7:

If site is suitable, work order is issued for site preparation (permits, utilities, steps/ramps, appliances).

Step 8:

Unit is installed at site. Utilities connected. (If site is commercial, FEMA handles utility connection; if site is private, survivor handles utility connection).

Step 9:

FEMA inspects unit to ensure it is ready for occupancy.

Step 10:

Details are approved, applicant signs a license to use the unit and receives the keys.

Variables that can affect timeline for delivery

- Applicant can't be reached to make an appointment to view the site
- Weather considerations
- Acquiring appropriate permits
- Excessive workload for utility companies
- Individual sites on private property (when compared to multiple sites on commercial properties)
- · Applicant unable to establish utility connection on private property

 For commercial sites, FEMA must identify properties and determine park rules, application process, price, utility availability, adjacent land use, hazmat conditions, and wetland implications.

MHUs are used as a **last resort**, after all other housing options have been exhausted.

Questions and Answers About Housing Assistance in Louisiana

Q: What kind of housing help can I receive from FEMA and SBA?

A: If you experienced losses from the August floods, housing assistance may be available to help you recover. Start the process by calling 800-621-3362 to register or apply online at disasterassistance.gov.

- FEMA programs include:
 - o Home repair grants,
 - o Temporary rental assistance,
 - o Other needs assistance for your personal property damage,
- The U.S. Small Business Administration offers low-interest disaster loans. Even if you don't own a business. As a homeowner or renter you may apply to the SBA for a loan to help you recover.

Q: Are there other types of help available?

A: Yes. We understand that sometimes survivors need additional help, so there are other programs that may be able to better assist you in your particular housing situation:

- Under our Transitional Sheltering Assistance program we may be able to put your family into a hotel. In the TSA program, you won't have to pay the bill yourself FEMA pays the hotel directly. You must register with FEMA first, to determine your eligibility for this program.
- If your house is not too badly damaged, you can sign up for a new Louisiana state program that pays for repairs so you can **shelter at home**. This assistance won't affect any possible grants from FEMA. To apply call **800-927-0216** or go to **shelterathome.la.gov**.

Q: Am I eligible for TSA?

A: If you are living in a car, in a non-participating hotel or motel, in a mass shelter, or at a place of employment, you may be eligible to receive TSA. If you meet any of these conditions, you may qualify for TSA even without having a FEMA housing inspector

determine if your house is habitable. Call FEMA at 800-621-3362 and let us know if your living situation has changed, we may be able to help you.

Q: If I'm in a TSA hotel now, can I also get money to repair my home?

A: Yes. The hotel costs are not deducted from whatever grant money you might receive from us.

Q: If I'm eligible for one housing program, does that mean I'm ineligible for other housing assistance or programs?

A: No. You may be eligible for more than one housing program. Assistance is based on a case-by-case basis, and we take into consideration your situation when deciding the programs that best suit your immediate needs.

Q: If I have flood insurance, am I disqualified from receiving housing assistance?

A: It depends on the kind of coverage your policy provides. By law, we cannot duplicate your insurance benefits but we may be able to help with the gaps that your insurance doesn't cover.

Q: How long will FEMA pay the rent for my temporary housing?

A: FEMA may provide rental assistance to eligible survivors for up to 18 months from the date of the disaster declaration. You will have to demonstrate an ongoing housing need and fill out a new application for additional rental assistance.

Q: I have heard about FEMA manufactured homes, how can I get one?

A: If other housing programs are **not an option** for you, *in some cases* a manufactured housing unit (MHU) can be made available and you can rebuild while you live in it. However, this is a last resort after all other housing alternatives have been considered and ruled out.

Q: What factors determine my eligibility for a MHU?

A: We take into consideration the severity of your losses and how long it will take to repair your home or find a safe place to live. FEMA's MHU program is only used in situations where no other housing options are available.

Q: If I receive an MHU, can I get any other type of housing assistance?

A: Yes. Homeowners may be eligible to receive assistance for home repairs while they stay in an MHU. Renters may be eligible for FEMA's Other Needs Assistance program to cover their personal property damage. Applicants may also be eligible for a low-interest

rate disaster loan from the U.S. Small Business Administration. Contact FEMA at 800-621-3362 or visit a local <u>disaster recovery center</u> for help navigating your options.

Q: Am I going to have to pay for the MHU?

A: As long as you remain eligible for direct housing assistance, you will not be charged rent but you may be responsible for utility bills.

Q: How long can I live in the MHU?

A: FEMA may provide a unit to an eligible applicant for up to 18 months from the date of this disaster declaration or Aug. 14, 2016. Survivors will have to meet routinely with a FEMA caseworker to show progress toward a permanent housing plan.

Q: Can I receive a manufactured home unit to live in on my property?

A: Our MHUs can *only* be placed once your local officials provide permits allowing the unit on your property.

If you live in a floodplain, a unit can only be placed there if there are no other housing resources, such as a commercial site or other rental properties in the area.

FEMA-provided units cannot be placed in a floodway or high-hazard coastal area. Floodways are controlled flooding areas near waterways like rivers. If you have questions about your flood zone determine, contact your local floodplain administrator.

Home Repairs Administered by FEMA



Helps flood survivors repair their home to make it safe, sanitary and secure so they can move back in. Administered through FEMA's Individuals and Households Program.

Who is eligible?

A homeowner whose FEMA-inspected primary residence has been determined to be uninhabitable due to the disaster and has a housing need that is not covered by insurance.

Additional Information

FEMA may provide funds for the homeowner to repair the foundation, roof, windows, doors, floors, walls, ceilings, HVAC, plumbing and electrical systems.

FEMA does not pay to return a home to its pre-disaster condition.

Application Process

- Register with FEMA by calling 800-621-3362 or going online to disasterassistance.gov.
- 2. An inspector may conduct a home visit.
- 3. Applicants will receive a determination letter.
- Eligible applicants will receive a check or electronic funds transfer.

Shelter at Home Program Administered by the State of Louisiana



Offers emergency repairs to damaged homes of flood survivors. Includes repairs not covered under NFIP.

Who is eligible?

Flood survivors who can make their home safe and sustainable while working on long-term repairs.

Additional Information

Work can include items such as mucking out the house, basic electrical restoration, installing a basic water heater, removing wet wall insulation, etc.

You don't have to register with FEMA to register for Shelter at Home. However, we encourage survivors to register with FEMA because they may be eligible for additional FEMA assistance.

Application Process

- Register with the State by calling 800-927-0216 or going online to shelterathome.la.gov.
- An inspector will determine if the applicant's home can be made safe and habitable within the funding limitations.
- The State administers the program.



Louisiana Temporary Housing Options

Flood survivors may be eligible for more than one of these programs.



Rental Assistance

Administered by FEMA



Offers temporary help so flood survivors have somewhere to live. Administered through FEMA's Individuals and Households Program.

Who may be eligible?

A survivor, either a homeowner or renter, whose FEMA-inspected home is determined to be uninhabitable due to the disaster, has housing needs that are not covered by insurance, and will relocate while repairs are being made.

The damage must have occurred to their primary residence.

Additional Information

The program temporarily pays for a place to live—such as a house, apartment, hotel or recreational vehicle—while a survivor makes home repairs or is transitioning to permanent housing.

It covers rent, a security deposit and essential utilities like electricity and water.

Application Process

- Register with FEMA by calling 800-621-3362 or going online to disasterassistance.gov.
- 2. An inspector may conduct a home visit.
- 3. Applicants will receive a determination letter.
- Eligible applicants will receive a check or electronic funds transfer.

Assistance Program Administered by FEMA



Offers room and tax costs in participating hotels to flood survivors, even before a FEMA housing inspection. Incidental costs are not included.

Who may be eligible?

A survivor whose primary home is uninhabitable or inaccessible due to the disaster and who is living in a car, hotel or motel, mass shelter or at a place of work and has housing needs that are not covered by insurance. Survivors do not need to wait for a FEMA housing inspection to be considered for eligibility.

Additional Information

A survivor who has a continued housing need may have their original checkout date extended. FEMA will contact applicants who are eligible for an extension to notify them of their new checkout date.

Application Process

- Register with FEMA by calling 800-621-3362 or going online to disasterassistance.gov.
- FEMA contacts eligible applicants to notify them they can participate in TSA.
- Applicant chooses a participating hotel and arranges a room. Find participating hotels online at femaevachotels.com.
- 4. Upon check-in, applicant will provide their registration number and an ID.
- FEMA contacts applicant throughout their stay to assist with future housing plans.

Direct Housing Program Administered by FEMA



Offers temporary Manufactured Housing Units (MHUs) to flood survivors.

Who may be eligible?

MHUs are an alternate solution for survivors whose primary home is uninhabitable, have uninsured housing needs, and have no other practicable temporary housing resources within a reasonable commuting distance from their primary residence.

Additional Information

MHUs may be provided for up to 18 months following the date of the disaster declaration (August 14, 2016).

Application Process

- 1. Register with FEMA by calling 800-621-3362 or going online to disasterassistance.gov.
- FEMA contacts applicants who might be eligible to discuss their interest and eligibility.
- Eligible applicants are matched with criteria to meet their temporary housing need.
- FEMA may provide applicants an MHU when there are no other reasonable temporary housing resources nearby. MHUs may be placed in floodplains, but never in floodways or high-hazard coastal areas.
- MHUs must follow strict safety protocols, including elevation and anchoring.

I'm writing because I've been disturbed by some of our encounters related to housing access for people with functional needs during the response to the flooding in Louisiana. I've cc-d Ms. Mary Troupe on this email only

because her and I worked so closely in the aftermath of Katrina, and I know from her experiences then as well as on FEMA's NAC, that she may have some good insights.

As of the daily status report issued for this morning-- more than one month since the disaster-- there are 5,091 requests from survivors with access & functional needs, only 1,781 of which have even been reviewed by FEMA.

During a recent call, it was noted that there was a shortage of accessible hotel rooms and so people with disabilities were not getting the transitional housing assistance they needed, and were instead on a wait list. On the same call, people noted that they were checked into accessible rooms although they didn't need the accessible functions, and whether they could do a call out to the hotels to see if people could be moved around so open up more accessible rooms.

This raised all kinds of questions for me, including 1) why this sort of call to the hotels hadn't been arranged more than a month ago; and 2) why we had no other options available for differently abled people that may need accessible temporary housing.

I remember in the aftermath of Katrina, when my good friend Charlie Tubre from the Advocacy Center had to stay with family when no appropriate housing was available. Even a strong advocate like him with access to all kinds of resources was trapped in the house where he was staying because of a lack of wheelchair ramp, and his brother had to take the family's bathroom door off the hinges every time Charlie needed to use the restroom, because the wheelchair just wouldn't fit otherwise. I know that we learned so many lessons since those days, and it's troubling to hear that we're still not where we need to be.

The good news is that we have heard-- although I haven't seen it substantiated-- that FEMA is not including the cost of accessibility functions in its maximum award of \$15,000 under the Shelter at Home program. Otherwise that would obviously be a pretty big fair housing issue. We've been working with folks to let them know we're available to assist with reasonable accommodation requests, esp for any permitting issues that ramps or other modifications might run into.

But I'd love to hear from others what transitional housing resources are available now for the 3,310 individuals whose cases haven't even been reviewed yet. We have been hosting a bi-weekly call of about 60 non-profit and faith based leaders. If there are resources that we are unaware of, please feel free to let me know and we'll get the info out to our networks.

has been living in a church for a month and says he had a very bad experience with Shelter At Home, after it appears an inspector promised extensive mold remediation with a special process that the state had, and instead a husband and wife came in with a wet rag and a bottle of Fabioso and began cleaning. He said they did a very poor job of cleaning. His biggest concern was the cleaning and sanitation and spraying for the mold, and he had a musicians' organization from out of state send in a group between the Shelter At Home treatment and the final inspection, so now it has been taken care of.

He is under the impression that he has not signed off on a final inspection yet, so I just want to make sure that as much can be done under the program for this gentleman as is needed. He is telling people that the program is either the state lying to people about the cost or contractors are stealing the money because so little value actually appears to be given to the homeowners. Said when he voiced his concern about the "cheap work" to a LAMAR inspector who came out to the house, the inspector said to him "You'd be surprised how much this is costing because there are a lot of hands in this."

I'm not sure how much of this was mis-impression on spart, but if there is anything we can do to help him be a little more satisfied before he signs off on his inspection, our office would really appreciate it. He apparently had problems with scheduling in the beginning, and just problems all the way through. I imagine he has been a boisterous customer, too, from the way he described his conversations with the inspectors and contractors.

One Month Mark for the Louisiana Shelter at Home Program

Baton Rouge, LA (September 28) – The Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) continues helping people return home with temporary repairs through the Louisiana Shelter at Home Program. An estimated 150 thousand homes in Louisiana received damage during the massive August 2016 flood event. The Shelter at Home Program enables eligible individuals or families whose homes were damaged to take shelter in their own homes while they rebuild.

"Governor John Bel Edwards listened to the public's call for this type of help following the flood," said GOHSEP Director Jim Waskom. "Shelter at Home is not meant to be the final step for a homeowner. It will provide you with a chance to stay in your home while you decide on long range plans and make final repairs. Registration for this historic program started one month ago. Shelter at Home is only one of the emergency housing solutions available to the public, but this unique approach will likely benefit thousands focused on staying home."

"The goal is to keep our communities whole while we all work on this tremendous recovery process," said Governor John Bel Edwards. We are working daily to continue to make the program even more responsive to homeowners' needs and provide the maximum amount of recovery help available under FEMA funding guidelines."

The program evaluates each applicant's home. If \$15,000 of work in that home can create a safe, secure, habitable place for the family to live while they continue their permanent home rebuilding, then that applicant may be eligible for this program. Contractors and subcontractors involved in the program will perform initial work such as mucking out the house, basic electrical restoration, installing a basic water heater, removing wet wall insulation, and providing up to \$500 in basic cooking or refrigerating appliances. This work will be provided at no out-of-pocket cost to the eligible homeowner. This assistance is independent of and will not affect determination of any Individual Assistance grant from FEMA. These essential emergency cleanup and minor repairs will help families get a jumpstart on their full recovery and live in at least a portion of their home, while they continue to finish the big task of making permanent repairs to their home.

Good Morning Alicia,

Good seeing you yesterday! I'm following up on our Shelter At Home (SAH) experience.

The process has been interesting/challenging and somewhat disappointing. As I mentioned per our conversation, the staff from Shelter At Home came out on September 27, 2016 to inspect the work done and it failed inspection. I am waiting to hear from the Contractor, Nature's Way,

The Contractor initially contacted me and came out on Wednesday, September 24, 2016. He indicated on the phone they would start that day. I met him at 11:30 and he said that we needed to move everything out of the house and he would get back with me. The SAH persons who came to do the initial consult on Sunday, September 18, 2016 told us it wasn't much and they should be able to work around the stuff or move it from room to room. The guy also said he didn't know anything about the sink, hot plate and mini refrigerator. I offered to call SAH while he was still at the house. He indicated he would call me later. I called him that evening and he said he was waiting to hear from SAH.

I called SAH the next day, September 22, 2016. The customer service helpdesk took the information. The Contractor called me that afternoon and said he would try to come Friday, September 23, 2016. If I didn't hear from him by 10:00 he wouldn't come until Monday, September 26, 2016.

The contractor's crew arrived promptly at 8:00am on Monday. They removed the cabinets from the bathroom. They had to pitch one but saved the other one. That was great! There were several items on the list they did not properly address. They mopped the floor but the brick pavers still are not clean. They installed the mud sink, stopped the toilet from moving and reinstalled the sink and vanity in the bathroom, however they all were leaking water and my husband had to call them back. The guy checked some of the electrical outlets but did not repair one. There are definitely two that do not work in the kitchen. They did not check the air conditioning unit. The contractor told my husband it obviously was working because the temperature in the house was cool. They also did not sanitize and clean the bathroom.

The Shelter At Home inspectors indicated we would get a refrigerator and hot plate once a shipment arrives. Hopefully soon? I told them not to send the contractor back I would take care of everything, but they said he had to come back. I'm planning to clean the bathroom and a room this weekend so that we can go home. This process has been ongoing for almost two weeks and we are not home!

Dear Ms. Gerhart-Hambrick,

Thank you for your email outlining your organization's concerns relating to housing access for people with disabilities and others with access and functional needs displaced by the August floods. I share your concerns. I know your organization is working zealously with other nonprofit and faith-based leaders to help identify potential resources for these disaster survivors.

FEMA is actively working to identify the access and functional needs of individuals and households within the displaced survivor population seeking temporary and intermediate housing solutions. FEMA has currently contacted and coordinated with over 2200 individuals who we have identified as having an access and functional need in order to confirm their current circumstances and clarify their needs. So far FEMA has provided over \$5M in rental assistance for applicants with access and functional needs and another \$32.6M in repair assistance to disaster survivors who have an access and functional need. There are another 114 families in Transitional Shelter Assistance (TSA) funded hotels where a member has an access or functional need. These numbers increase with

each passing day because of ongoing disaster assistance registrations and further clarity about the needs of affected individuals and households.

You asked about transitional housing resources available now for disaster survivors with disabilities and others with access and functional needs, in particular those households whose applications have not been reviewed by the Agency yet because of the volume. We continue to contact households to confirm their current circumstances and clarify their needs.

At this time, FEMA is working with the private sector, including State associations for hotel operators, realtors, and apartment managers to enlist their assistance with transitional housing in general as well as specific accessible housing options to meet the individual needs of people with disabilities and others with access and functional needs in connection with temporary, intermediate and long-term housing solutions. FEMA has engaged with Crisis Counselors, as well as state and non-profit partners to assist in meeting the needs of these survivors. TSA, one of FEMA's disaster assistance programs, selected by the State is intended to provide short-term sheltering to families who were displaced from their homes by the flooding. Because several hundred thousand families in Louisiana have been displaced, hotel space is at a premium and the hotel operators are working hard with the State and other organizations to meet those needs. Yet, it is a finite resource managed by the hotel owners.

As you pointed out, the Shelter at Home program, a program run by the state of Louisiana, is the preferred intermediate housing solution to use while long-term repairs are undertaken. When that is not a viable option, another option for eligible families is a Manufactured Housing Unit (MHU). In addition to your organization's and similar organizations' assistance to make hotel operators aware of the needs this population is facing as the hotels manage their internal inventories, FEMA has several thousand MHUs en route to Louisiana to provide another temporary housing solution. As you may be aware, FEMA has MHUs in its inventory that comply with the Uniform Federal Accessibility Standards and the Agency can also modify standard MHUs to accommodate survivors with disabilities. FEMA has a process for survivors with disabilities and others with access and functional needs who are eligible for an MHU to identify their needs and receive the appropriate MHU. In fact, the very first MHU placed in Louisiana was a UFAS unit, provided to an eligible household. More have been provided and many others are in the pipeline as FEMA continues to identify and meet needs in this deliberate process.

Thank you for this opportunity to provide a brief snap-shot of the direct housing assistance FEMA is providing to disaster survivors after the recent floods. Should you have additional concerns, please contact me at marcie.roth@fema.dhs.gov.

Ms. Roth and Ms. Polotzola,

I'm writing because I've been disturbed by some of our encounters related to housing access for people with functional needs during the response to the flooding in Louisiana. I've cc-d Ms. Mary Troupe on this email only because her and I worked so closely in the aftermath of Katrina, and I know from her experiences then as well as on FEMA's NAC, that she may have some good insights.

As of the daily status report issued for this morning-- more than one month since the disaster-- there are 5,091 requests from survivors with access & functional needs, only 1,781 of which have even been reviewed by FEMA.

During a recent call, it was noted that there was a shortage of accessible hotel rooms and so people with disabilities were not getting the transitional housing assistance they needed, and were instead on a wait list. On the same call, people noted that they were checked into accessible rooms although they didn't need the accessible functions, and whether they could do a call out to the hotels to see if people could be moved around so open up more accessible rooms.

This raised all kinds of questions for me, including 1) why this sort of call to the hotels hadn't been arranged more than a month ago; and 2) why we had no other options available for differently abled people that may need accessible temporary housing.

I remember in the aftermath of Katrina, when my good friend Charlie Tubre from the Advocacy Center had to stay with family when no appropriate housing was available. Even a strong advocate like him with access to all kinds of resources was trapped in the house where he was staying because of a lack of wheelchair ramp, and his brother had to take the family's bathroom door off the hinges every time Charlie needed to use the restroom, because the wheelchair just wouldn't fit otherwise. I know that we learned so many lessons since those days, and it's troubling to hear that we're still not where we need to be.

The good news is that we have heard-- although I haven't seen it substantiated-that FEMA is not including the cost of accessibility functions in its maximum award of \$15,000 under the Shelter at Home program. Otherwise that would obviously be a pretty big fair housing issue. We've been working with folks to let them know we're available to assist with reasonable accommodation requests, esp for any permitting issues that ramps or other modifications might run into.

But I'd love to hear from others what transitional housing resources are available now for the 3,310 individuals whose cases haven't even been reviewed yet. We have been hosting a bi-weekly call of about 60 non-profit and faith based leaders. If there are resources that we are unaware of, please feel free to let me know and we'll get the info out to our networks.

I did pass by your office this last week, leaving a card and a brief note letting you know that I will be the Governor's Office Intergovernmental Liaison. I look forward to working with you and the Governor's team assigned to working the recent flooding. I would appreciate your letting other associates of yours, working cases and needing assistance, know my contact information listed below.

Constituent is currently living in a MHU and called to complain about appliances (refrigerator) that aren't working. She was told by a representative with FEMA's Maintenance Hotline (888-414-1989) that FEMA is not responsible for repairing appliances.

When keys are turned over to the resident, that is the last contact with the installation contractor. When the FEMA Maintenance Hotline ((888-414-1989) is called a work order is issued to the FEMA Maintenance Team to address the issue, they first travel to the home site to determine what may be wrong and then are directed to do whatever it take to correct the deficiency. In this case the fridge has been a problem so, it was replaced last week. The phone number to report Maintenance issues for the home is correct as listed in the her email.

Caller states he has a working visa and working on obtaining a green card. He states he was denied by FEMA and SBA because he isn't a US citizens. He has two children and says they are living in their gutted home. He was provided with the Shelter at Home information.

Does citizenship status determine if a person is granted or denied FEMA?

Below is a thorough procedure used determining the eligibility of Non-Citizen National or Qualified Aliens

Citizenship

What help is there for people who are not United States citizens?

If you are not a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National or Qualified Alien, you may still be eligible for assistance if you are the parent or guardian of a minor child who resides with you and who is a United States Citizen, Non-Citizen National, or Qualified Alien. You can register for assistance using the child's Social Security number. If your child is a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National or

Qualified Alien, but does not have a Social Security number, you can still apply for FEMA assistance by obtaining your child a Social Security number and calling FEMA to register within 60 days of the disaster declaration date. If you have any questions concerning your right to apply, or need assistance locating volunteer agencies to help you, you may call the FEMA 1-800 number.

What are FEMA's citizenship/immigration requirements?

- a. You must be a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National, or a Qualified Alien in order to be eligible for FEMA cash assistance programs: Individuals and Households Program Assistance and Disaster Unemployment Assistance.
- A Qualified Alien includes anyone with legal permanent residence ("green card"), refugee or asylum status, withholding of deportation, conditional entry, parole into the U.S. for at least 1 year for humanitarian purposes; is a Cuban-Haitian Entrant; or has a pending or approved petition for relief based on battery or extreme cruelty by a family member.
- You will be asked to sign a Declaration and Release (FEMA Form 90-69B) that you are a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National, or a Qualified Alien.
- If you cannot sign the Declaration and Release, another adult household member who is eligible can sign it and no information regarding your status will be gathered.
- If you cannot sign the Declaration and Release but you have a minor child who is a U.S. Citizen or a Qualified Alien residing with you, you can apply for assistance on your child's behalf and no information regarding your status will be gathered. You will be asked to sign a declaration that your child is a U.S. Citizen, Non-Citizen National, or a Qualified Alien.
- You do not have to be a U.S. Citizen or a Qualified Alien for Crisis Counseling or Disaster Legal Services or for other short-term, non-cash emergency assistance.

If I am an undocumented immigrant, am I eligible for assistance for disaster-related needs?

a. Yes, you may be eligible under many different programs run by state and local agencies and voluntary agencies for various typed of cash assistance.

If I am an undocumented immigrant, am I eligible for any assistance from FEMA?

- a. You may be eligible for short-term, non-cash, emergency aid provided by FEMA.
- You will not be **personally** eligible for FEMA cash assistance programs (Individuals and Households Program Assistance); however, you may apply on behalf of your U.S. citizen child, or another adult household member may qualify the household for assistance.
- If I am an undocumented immigrant, can I apply on behalf of my child who was born in the United States?
 - a. You can apply on behalf of your minor child (under 18 years of age) for FEMA cash assistance (Individuals and Households Program Assistance) if you live together.

You will not have to provide any information on your immigration status or sign any documents regarding your status.

Do I need a social security number to register for FEMA cash assistance (Individuals and Households Program Assistance)?

a. If you are applying on your minor child's behalf, you should provide his or her social security number.

Are foreign students studying in the United States eligible for FEMA cash assistance (Individuals and Households Program Assistance) as "Qualified Aliens"?

a. While foreign students may qualify for non-cash in-kind disaster relief (such as search and rescue, provision of food, water, sheltering, or emergency medical assistance), they do not qualify for cash assistance because their authorization to reside in the United States is based in part on the existence of an in-country support system.

If I have a social security number, am I eligible for FEMA cash assistance (Individuals and Households Program Assistance) as a "Qualified Alien"?

a. Not necessarily, because having a Social security number does not automatically mean that you are a Qualified Alien. You may be legally present in the U.S. and have a social security number, but not be a Qualified Alien.

My name is and I am a member of and I am a member of and you wanted me to update you on this matter. I will try to give you a Timeline on what has taken place:

09/15/16 - Shelter at Home Case Manager inspections of my home on 09/16/16.

contacted me to setup an

09/16/16 - came out and inspected my home. Offers made during the inspection:

Clean house, take up tile, replace window unit, check wiring, replace hot water heater, check outside air condition unit and gas lines

09/17/16 - Contacted and advised him that I was not offered a mini fridge, hot plate, nor microwave.

Mr. Paff stated everything that was offered

on 09/16/16 was all that they were allowed to offer. Items on my inspection date were the only items approved for all clients seen on 09/16/16. He stated he will need to get an approval to offer any additional appliances.

09/17/16 - Contacted back after finding out that a mini fridge, hot plate, nor a microwave were not offered. He stated he will update my notes to make sure everything will be included.

09/29/16 - Contacted I sagain to get an update on my status. He informed me that he is no longer my Case Manager and was unsure of who I have been assigned to and he has no way of finding out.

09/29/16 - My Supervisors with the E emailed of my concerns, but as of today I have not received any feedbacks from .y.

09/30/16 - Received a miss call from approximately around 5pm. Attempted to call back, but was transferred to a voice message. Left voice message with my Claim # and mobile number, but never received a call back.

10/2/16 - Received a call from a Shelter at Home Contractor and was told that he was informed by my neighbor that since my inspection no one has started on my

home, so he will go ahead and get it started. He made an appointment to start the work on 10/03/16 and informed that he will be working on my

ABOUT SHELTER AT HOME

Rebuilding a home after disaster strikes is challenging enough without having to relocate away from your property.

Louisiana's Shelter at Home Program is helping eligible survivors whose homes were damaged in the August 2016 flooding stay in their homes during the process.

Shelter at Home provides temporary, bare minimum remediation to make a home safe and habitable during the rebuilding.

ELIGIBILITY

- · You must own and live in the home.
- It is determined your property can be made "safe and habitable" for up to \$15,000.
- While you do not have to register with FEMA to qualify for Shelter at Home, we encourage you to do so because you may be eligible for assistance from other FEMA programs.
- If you have registered with FEMA and are interested in this program, you must also apply for Shelter at Home.

FIVE STEPS TO SHELTER AT HOME

Step 1 - Application

 Apply for the program online at <u>www.ShelterAtHome.la.gov</u> or call 800-927-0216. A program representative will contact you to schedule the initial site visit at your home.

Step 2 - Site Visit

• You will set up a time to meet an inspector from AECOM (the engineering firm working with the state), and a contractor at your home. On that day, they will inspect the property to determine whether the temporary repairs can make your home safe and habitable according to program guidelines. For example, if flood waters did not exceed 24 inches, the home is likely eligible for the program. If your home qualifies and you agree to the work to be done on your home, you will be asked to sign a right-of-entry form.

Step 3 – Work Appointment

• The contractor will call you to schedule a time to begin the agreed upon-temporary repairs.

Step 4 - Construction

 The contractor and subcontractors will make the repairs to your home. There will be specialists such as electricians and plumbers working on your home at different times and days. You should consider the repair work ongoing until the final inspection is ordered.

Step 5 – Final Inspection

 You will meet with the inspector and the contractor for a final walk-through of your home to review the repairs. All parties must sign off if they agree the work has been completed.

VARIABLES AFFECTING PROGRAM DELIVERY:

- Clean-up
- Drywall, insulation removal
- Quality control issues
- Right-of-entry access approval

The Federal Emergency Management Agency reimburses the State of Louisiana 90 percent of the costs for the Shelter at Home Program.

DEADLINE TO REGISTER IS OCTOBER 15, 2016

ELIGIBLE WORK

The program offers key basic initial work that includes emergency clean-up and minor essential repairs to get people back home to make more permanent repairs.

INTERIOR

- Inspect and test electrical, HVAC and plumbing systems to ensure they are safe and work.
- Remove drywall, insulation and other waterabsorbing wall coverings (excluding fire-rated walls) damaged by flooding.
- Remove flood-damaged water-absorbing flooring material such as carpet, padding and other materials.
- Clean and sanitize the exposed floor and wall surfaces where flooring or wall coverings were removed.
- Remove debris from the street right-of-way.
- Ensure the home has one (1) temporary working bathroom, which could entail cleaning or repair.
- Maintain heating and minimum air conditioning for comfort.
- Repair or replace damaged water heaters.
- Inspect and repair natural gas lines if necessary.
- Test and repair, or replace and install smoke and carbon monoxide detectors.
- Provide mini-refrigerators and microwaves as necessary. (The appliance allowance is \$500 where needed).

EXTERIOR

- Take temporary actions to weatherproof the home and prevent water intrusion; repairs could be temporary patches.
- Patch doors (minor and quick repairs), replace door hardware, and replace/repair door jambs and headers as necessary for secure entry and exit.
- Secure broken windows with minor carpentry or hardware repairs.
- Repair damaged entry stairs or porches to allow safe entrance and exit.
- Ensure that plumbing is connected to a sanitary sewer or approved sewage disposal system.
- Ensure that potable water is available and operational.



The contractor will make sure the electrical system is safe and working. This patch of drywall with the electrical outlet is temporary but functional.



The kitchen sink is framed in and missing cabinets but functional.



Exterior doors will provide a secure entry and exit.

HOW TO CHECK YOUR STATUS

If you apply for Shelter at Home, the State of Louisiana will assign you a Case Manager to work directly with you. If you have applied for the program but have not been contacted, you can call 800-927-0216 and ask to speak to your Case Manager. Be sure to ask for the Case Manager's direct line and email to make contact easier.
