LSU-FLORIDA GAME POSTPONED

BIRMINGHAM, Alabama (October 6, 2016) – The LSU-Florida football game scheduled for Saturday in Gainesville has been postponed due to Hurricane Matthew, it was announced Thursday. The universities and the SEC Office will work to reschedule the game later in the 2016 season if possible.

"We had a very productive phone call today with a great spirit of cooperation between the universities' presidents and athletics directors and it became clear that the University of Florida could neither host nor travel to a game this weekend considering the circumstances," said SEC Commissioner Greg Sankey. "The developments of the hurricane in the last 24 hours, the projected magnitude of its impact and the unknown aftermath of this storm have resulted in this decision to seek another date to play the LSU-Florida game. We have to be sensitive to the possible imminent disruption to the state of Florida and in particular the Gainesville and surrounding area."

At this time the schools do not have a common open date on which to reschedule the game, so the schools and SEC Office will make every effort to find a scheduling solution with the possible movement of other games on the schools' schedules.

Before deciding to postpone the game, the schools and SEC explored other date and location options, and LSU offered to either travel or host the game over the course of the weekend. Ultimately it was determined that the likelihood of damage from the storm, lack of available emergency personnel and the uncertainty of the impact of the storm on people, facilities and travel necessitated a postponement.

"The timing of this storm on a Friday and the uncertainty of its aftermath in the ensuing days make it particularly difficult to project the conditions for the remainder of the weekend as well as the opportunity for travel of teams and fans to or from Gainesville and other cities in Florida," Sankey said. "I am appreciative of the cooperation of our universities on this matter."

Good morning.

Attached you will find correspondence we have forwarded to the NCAA staff related to remaining concerns associated with consideration of the early National Letter of Intent signing date.

While we have continued to monitor discussion on this topic, we learned late last week this will move more quickly than we had previously understood.

Fundamentally, we have two concerns which have not been addressed in the current dialogue:

1. Any early signing date will reduce the opportunity for institutions to evaluate prospective student-athletes academic credentials, test scores or personal conduct. Given that we remain an educational endeavor, removing the opportunity for more complete academic evaluations is not the appropriate direction for football signing day; and
2. While concerns mount regarding the proliferation of early recruitment in every other sport, adopting an early signing date in football will necessarily move the recruiting calendar earlier, create more summer recruiting activity and further enfranchise non-scholastic interests in football recruiting. This move is contrary to the discussion in every other sport.

We are confident in our conference members' ability to recruit regardless of the date or calendar, however, the current ideas around early signing will unnecessarily harm the recruiting climate in football, reduce the academic information available before scholarships are offered, and remove learning opportunities for prospective student-athletes.

We appreciate the review of this information.

Emergency Operations Team, Policy Group and Others – below and attached is updated information regarding Hurricane Matthew. Please review the attached slides for more details.

Hurricane Matthew

- At 8am, Matthew was located 215 miles SE of West Palm Beach with maximum sustained winds of 125mph (category 3).
- On the forecast track, the center will move through the Bahamas today and very close to the east coast of the Florida Peninsula tonight through Friday night.
- Additional strengthening is expected today, and Matthew is forecast to be a category 4 hurricane as it approaches the east coast of Florida.
- Only a small deviation of the track to the left of the NHC forecast could bring the core of a major hurricane onshore within the hurricane warning area in Florida and Georgia. However, a small deviation to the right could keep the hurricane-force winds offshore.
- Hurricane Warning is in effect for Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie, Indian River, Brevard, Volusia, Osceola, Orange, Seminole, Okeechobee, Flagler, Nassau, Duval, St. Johns, Putnam, and Clay Counties, along with Lake Okeechobee.
- Tropical Storm Warning is in effect for Miami-Dade, Monroe, Inland Collier, Hendry, Glades, Highlands, Lake, Sumter, Polk, Hardee, Marion, Alachua, Union, Bradford, Columbia, and Baker Counties.
- Tropical Storm Watch is in effect for Coastal Collier, Charlotte, Sarasota, Manatee, Desoto, Hillsborough, Pinellas, Pasco, Hernando, Citrus, and Levy Counties.

Local Impacts

- A Tropical Storm Warning is in effect for Alachua County.
- Winds: The Tropical Storm Warning product from NWS-Jacksonville forecasts a peak winds of 30-40mph with gusts to 60mph in Gainesville. The window for tropical storm force winds is Friday morning until Saturday morning, with the highest probability general from noon to midnight. Emergency Plans should include a reasonable threat for strong tropical storm force winds of 58-73mph.
- Rain: Rainfall of 2-4 inches over the course of the storm is forecast.
- Alachua County Public Schools, SFC, City of Gainesville and Alachua County are all closed on Friday.
- Alachua County is opening one special needs and two general population shelters this evening.

UF Actions

- UF main campus is on normal operations today and closed tomorrow.
- Most UF facilities in impacted South and Central Florida areas are closed today.
- All UF units in impacted areas (including Alachua County) should finalize tropical weather preparations today.
- The Emergency Operations Team and Policy Group are both meeting today.
- A UF sheltering decision will be made today.
- The University EOC will be staffed on Friday through the duration of the storm.
